Elwood Oversized Catchall Toddler Bib © Kim Gean October 26, 2008



I came up with this idea because my granddaughter was learning to eat with utensils and we all know it seems more food goes into their laps than into their mouth. LOL I also believed that it needed to be oversized for the spills down the sides also. The catchall will hopefully save the pants. For smaller sized go down hook size. Here is another view to see the catchall/mouth. Remember you can make it anyway you want, change colors, make bigger, smaller, a bigger catchall by adding more rows.



Also, double check the rows because this hasn't been tested and I had some help by the way of a 2 yr old and my counting may be off. LOL If you find a problem please let me know.

Materials

G Hook

F Hook

Red Worsted Weight Yarn

White Worsted Weight Yarn

Small amount black and orange worsted weight yarn

With G Hook

Ch 41

In 2nd from HK sc and sc across chain, ch 1, turn

Row 2-24 sc each row

Row 25-27 sc dec in next 2 sc, sc across row until last 2 stitches, sc dec. over next 2, ch 1, turn (should

have 34 stitches)

Row 28-39 sc in each st across and ch 1 turn

Row 40: Sc in first 12 sc, leave rest of sts unworked, ch 1, turn.

Row 41: Dec over first 2 sc, sc in next 10 sc, ch 1, turn. (have 11 st now)

Row 42: Sc in ea sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 43: Dec over first 2 sc, sc in next 9 sc, ch1, turn (have 10 st now)

Row 44: SC in ea sc across, ch1, turn

Row 45: Dec over first 2 sc. sc in next 8 sc, ch1, turn (have 9 st now)

Rows 46-51 repeat row 42 At the end of row 51 FO

Other Side

Row 40: Attach yarn to other side on the outside. Sc in next 12 sts, ch 1 turn

Row 41: Dec over first 2 sc, sc in next 10 sc, ch 1, turn. (have 11 st now)

Row 42: Sc in ea sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 43: Dec over first 2 sc, sc in next 9 sc, ch1, turn (have 10 st now)

Row 44: SC in ea sc across, ch1, turn

Row 45: Dec over first 2 sc. sc in next 8 sc, ch1, turn (have 9 st now)

Rows 46-51 repeat row 42 At the end of row 51 FO

Catchall

Row 1 Ch 41, sc in 2nd ch from hk and in each ch across

Row 2 ch 1 turn sc across

Rows 3-10 repeat row2 FO at end of row 10 (add more rows for a bigger catchall)

With white attach to right side of bib and sc all around the bib. Add a ch of 50 to each corner of the neck for the ties securing them with a couple of sc.

With White attach to a sc on the side of the catch all and sc around the sides and bottom, sc around the

top is optional. Fo leaving a long tail. Line up the catchall with the bottom of the bib and whip st both pieces together. I used the back loop of the catchall with the front loop of the sc on the bib.

EYES

with white and F hook ch 4 sl to form a ring, 6 sc in ring. 2 sc in each sc, sl st to 1st sc ch 1 sc in each sc around. FO leave tail for sewing.

Pupil

with black and F hook ch 4 sl to form ring, 4 sc in loop of each ch. You can leave flat or pull up tight for raised pupil. FO leave tail for sewing to eye.

Nose

Rnd 1 Orange and F hook, ch 3 sl to form ring, 6 sc in ring join to 1 st sc, ch 1

Rnd 2 2 sc in each sc

Rnd 3 2 sc in each sc

Rnd 4 sc in blo of each sc around
