

One 13" Indian Doll 1 skien of your favorite color yarn half skein of your favorite coordinate amount of yarn for small Fringe (optional)

hooks and eyes


There are many ways to embellish your You are only limited by your doll. imagination. Seed Beads look great on the bodice.

I had to use red for fringe because her headband was glued to her head and I

didn't want to ruin her trying to get it off. I ordered my dolls from Cassie Hennen so if your stores don't have your Indian Doll that is where I got mine.



After the 1st stitch,



Bodice F hk

Options Ch 1 at end of each row. If you do not want the jagged looking edge DO NOT ch 1. Makes the back edges neater.

chain 16

Row 1 SC in 2nd ch from hook and each rem sc across, turn

Row 2 SC (in the very 1st st...refer to picture above) in each sc across, turn

Row 3 2 sc in each sc across,turn

Row 4-5 SC in each sc across, turn

Row 6 SC in first 5 sc, 2 sc in each of next 20 sc, sc in last 5, turn

Row 7 SC in first 6 sc, ch 4 skip next 10 sc, armhole made , sc in next 18 sc, ch 4, skip next 10 sc armhole made, sc in last 6 sc ,turn

Row 8 SC in each sc and ch across, turn

Row 9 SC in each sc across, turn

Row 10 SC in first 9 sc, *decrease next 2 sc together (to decrease , draw up a lp in each of next 2 sc- 3 lps now on hook, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook) repeat * 9 more times, sc to end,turn

Row 11-12 SC in each sc across, turn

Row 13 SC in first sc, * decrease over next 2 sc, sc in next 5; repeat from * twice more, decrease over next 2 sc, sc to end ,turn (NOTE: depending on your doll you may want to do this row one more time if breast area is too big)

Row 14 SC in each sc across, turn

Row 15 BLO (NOTE: if not using fringe then go thru both loops) SC in each sc across, turn

Row 16 Ch 2, Dc in each st across, turn

Row 17 With G hk Ch 2, Dc in east across and join to ch, you will now be working in rnds.

Rnd 18 Ch 2, Dc in east across and join to ch (will do this every round unless stated otherwise)

Rnd 19 Ch 2, *Dc in next st, 2 Dc in next* repeat around

Rnd 20 Ch 2 *Dc in next 2 st, 2 Dc in next* repeat around

Rnd 21 Ch 2 *Dc in next 3 st, 2 Dc in next* repeat around

Rnd 22 Ch 2 *Dc in next 4st, 2 Dc in next* repeat around

Rnd 23 Ch 2 *Dc in next 5 st, 2 Dc in next* repeat around

Rnd 24 Ch 2 *Dc in next 6 st, Attach next color, Carry 2nd color loosely behind, 2 Dc in next* repeat around

Rnd 25 Ch 2 *Dc in next 6 st, Attach primary color, Carry 2nd color loosely behind, 2 Dc decrease over next 2 sts (they should be lined up under the 2 stitches from your row above* repeat around

Rnd 26 With primary color Ch 2 *Dc in next 6 st, , 2 Dc in next* repeat around

Rnd 27 Ch 2 *Dc in next 5 st, 2 Dc in next* repeat around

Rnd 28 *Ch 3, Dc in next st, Hdc in next, Sc in next, sl st in next, * repeat around ending with sl st

Shoes

G hk (NOTE- I have never had 2 shoes for one of these dolls ever come out the same. this is a guideline on how I made her shoes and they weren't exactly the same. LOL If some one comes up with a good moccasin pattern please email <u>me</u>)

Row 1 Ch 7, sc in 2nd ch from hk, sc in ea ch to last ch, 3 sc in last ch, keep going around and sc in other side of ch to beginning and, 2 sc in last ch and join to 1st sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, BLO (fl make the sole) sc in ea st around and join

Row 3 ch 1, sc aorund to last 2 st an sc decrease 2gether (heel) and join

Row 4 ch 1, sc in next 5 st sc decrease next 3 2gether (toe) sc to last 2 st sc decrease

ch 1 sl st to toe and sc decrease 3 toe st together and sl st around and join , FO

Undies

Row 1 Ch 13, sc in 2^{nd} ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 1, turn (Ch 1 and turn at end of each row)

Row 2-4 Sc across

Row 5 - 6 sl st in 1st sc, sc across to last sc, leave that last st unworked, turn

Row 7 - 10 sc across

Row 11 - Repeat row 5

Row 12-16 Repeat row 7

Row 17-23 2 sc in 1^{st} st, sc to last st, 2 sc in last st.

Row 24-25 Sc across, Fasten Off
